The registration data is stored in a database on a server of our provider and in our score processing program on a laptop. This information is used to determine for the benefit of the tournament in which class the participants play and to show the results achieved by the participants. The display is done by means of publication in the bowling house (only first name, last name) and on the website (<https://juniordutchopen.com>).

We delete data in the database (on our provider's server) immediately after the tournament, data in our score program is deleted if a player requests it (send an e-mail to [info@juniordutchopen.com](mailto:info@juniordutchopen.com)) or after the player is older than is 25 years old. The Junior Dutch Open Foundation takes the necessary security measures to protect the (personal) data on both the website and the hardware used.

After the tournament, the fields marked with 1) are shared with the NBF for the calculation of the pass average and the fields marked with 2) are shared with the Junior Dutch Open Foundation, which publishes the results on their website (<https://juniordutchopen.com/>).
