GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS JUNIOR DUTCH OPEN

Registration

- 1. By submitting the registration form you indicate that participant, parents, trainer and coach agree with the General Terms and Conditions of the Junior Dutch Open.
- 2. Participation in this tournament is open to all NBF members and members with an IBF (International Bowling Federation) license up to 25 years (age limit: 1 July of any year) [art. 527].
- 3. At the time of registration, it must be indicated if a trainer/coach will be used. This trainer/coach must be a fully certified EBF Level II or USBC Silver bowling. When registering on the day of play, the tournament organization will check whether the trainer/coach is certified.
- 4. Registration for the Junior Dutch Open is official once payment for the entry/re-entry(ies) has been received and confirmed by the organisation.
 - a. A deposit of 25% of the total reserved entry(ies), after which the participant will receive a link 3 months before the start of the tournament to pay the remainder of the reservation.
 - b. Full payment of the reserved entry(ies) immediately after the reservation is completed.

The participant has the right to cancel his/her booked entry and/or re-entry(ies) up to 14 days after receipt without giving any reason. You will then be credited with the registration fees (minus any costs associated with refunding booked entry(ies)). To exercise this right, please contact us at register@juniordutchopen.com.

- 5. The entry fees are to be always paid, even in case of no-show.
- 6. By submitting the entry form you agree that participant, parents, trainer and coach allowed to place pictures of the concerning persons on the website and social media.
